WWE scrubs sex scenes from McMahon's time as CEO

The company co-founded by Republican U.S. Senate candidate Linda McMahon and now run by her husband - World Wrestling Entertainment Inc. — has ordered the Internet video site YouTube to remove sexually explicit excerpts of its programming that could embarrass McMahon.

The videos are full of material that McMahon's political opponents and other critics have called pornographic or offensive.


owned by Google, has scrubbed the videos in response to a demand by WWE, which as a copyright holder issued a "takedown notice" under the terms of a 1998 federal law.

WWE made similar demands in 2009, shortly after McMahon stepped down as the company's chief executive officer and prepared for her first campaign for the Senate.
